



Protecting Our Loved Ones from Senior Scams



S eniors make easy targets for scams because they are available; they are retired, they're home, they read their mail and answer their phones. They are more likely to have a nest egg and less likely to report they were scammed and if they do report it, their memory may prevent them from providing detailed information.

The National Crime Prevention Center (NCPC) reports that seniors over age 60 are targets of 49% of telemarketing scams involving medical care services and products, 41% involving sweepstakes and prizes and 40% involving magazine sales. The NCPC reports each victim of sweepstakes fraud lost an average of \$7,000. Although my mother in law had very little money when she passed away, we did find several thousand dollars in bogus sweepstakes tickets that she had purchased.

To prevent this, you can monitor your loved ones' mail. Look for stacks of unsolicited mail with various offers for money or prizes. See if they have received packages of cheap costume jewelry or other gifts. Offer to help balance their checkbook and look for any unusual large withdrawals or checks to companies you never heard of and check credit card statements, as well.

As you can see, when someone we love becomes vulnerable, there are many people ready to take advantage. Sometimes the solution is to take control of their affairs as a trustee or conservator. But often, all that is necessary is a Power of Attorney or simply a heart to heart talk.

Little Known Facts About Some of the World's Most Famous Foods

Most famous foods usually have some kind of a story behind them as to how they were made. Some foods were even made mistakenly, like chocolate chip cookies and potato chips. Some of these stories have been handed down through the generations, and some, well let's just say, some might be that of urban legends like the Snapple brand soft drink. The original

Snapple drink was said to explode when opened; the apple juice inside fermented. The name is a combination of the word snap and apple.

Potato chips were said to be made by an irate chef in 1853 at the diner, the Moon Lodge, in Saratoga Springs, NY. The chef's name was George Crum. When a customer complained that his fried potatoes were cut too thick, Crum cut the potatoes paper thin out of spite, fried them, and served them to the customer. Guess what, the customer loved them and so did everyone else.

During a day at the fair, a vender ran out of ice cream cups to serve the ice cream in and a quick thinking attendant used large rolled up waffles to hold the ice cream. The waffle ice cream became a big hit. This led to the making of the waffle cone.

Did you know that Doritos were first sold in the 1950's at a little place called Casa De Fritos in the Frontierland section of the park in Disneyland?

Flaming hot Cheetos were developed by a janitor, Richard Montanez, at a California Frito Lay Plant. He took some Fritos home and add-

> ed his own seasonings to them, took them back to work to see what his co workers thought of them, and when the response was a positive one, he pitched the idea of hot cheetos to his boss. Before long, they were up on the shelves. Wonder if Richard remained a janitor after that!

Think about the irony of this. The Cotton Candy machine was developed by a former Tennessee State Dental Association President named William J. Morrison and was

first called Fairy Floss.

Who didn't have a Pez candy dispenser as a kid? Do you remember what character you had? The candy was first developed as a smoking alternative by a German company. The dispensers were made to look like a lighter.

The White Castle burger Franchise was founded by a couple of guys in response to author Upton Sinclair's book, *The Jungle*, which exposed Americans to the horrific conditions of urban slaughterhouses. The white in White Castle was supposed to convey purity. Chocolate chip cookies were improved by Ruth Graves Wakefield and her husband. They owned the Toll House Inn in Massachusetts. One day when making cookies for her guests, Ruth ran out of baking chocolate and substituted the chocolate with semi sweet chocolate instead. She noticed that the chocolate didn't break down and fully melt like the other chocolate they used and when she served

them to her guests, they loved them. Did you ever hear of Toll House cookies?



The Snickers Bar was named after the Mars Family's favorite horse called Snickers in the 1930s. Popsicles were actually a mistake. Eleven-year-old Frank Epperson was mixing powdered sugar and water to make a soda pop. He left the mixing bucket outside with the wooden stick in it on a very chilly night. The next morning he noticed the whole thing was frozen. When he licked it, it tasted great. He started selling the Epperson

icicles for five cents and later changed the name to popsicles, a new cool treat.

German chocolate cake isn't really German. It is named after Samuel German, developer of the baking chocolate that goes in the cake.

The Snickers Bar was named after the Mars Family's favorite horse called Snickers in the 1930s.

Some creations were made that were originally intended to be medicine like Pepsi Cola. John Pember-

ton made up a batch of what he thought would be a cure for dyspepsia. When his assistant tasted it, he raved at the taste so they decided to mix it up with carbonated water and sell it as a soft drink. The name Pepsi came from the word dyspepsia.

7-up originally contained a mood altering inhibiting drug called lithium citrate. It was a popular mood stabilizer in the nineteen and twentieth century.

The soda, Fanta, was a product of Germany, during the Nazi period. Due to a loss of supplies during World War II, Coca Cola's German CEO Max Keith, had to come up with a replacement soda. Fanta was made out

of mixing up leftover ingredients.

Coca Cola originally contained coke in its syrup. The coke was removed in 1903.

Corn Flakes were developed by brothers John Harvey and William Kelly in the 1800's. It was purposely made to be plain and starch free and a healthy source of nutrition to feed John Harvey's patients. He was Chief of Medicine at the Battle Creek Health Clinic. The brothers attempted to put together healthy starch free bread that had some taste to it. The first batches didn't work out. They were too mushy. The Kelly brothers were called away for a few days and when they came

back the wheat hardened and William for some reason put it through the rollers and noticed that the wheat didn't stick and even better than that, the individual morsels tasted good. They made up another batch of wheat grains and perfected the cereal. The plainness of the cereal was also meant to calm down ones libido.

Graham Crackers were invented by Sylvester Graham, a Presbyterian Minister. It was aimed at getting people to control their libido. When they had amoral thoughts, they would reach for a graham cracker instead. Wonder how well that really worked?

Hats Off to the Horses

The Horse Park of New Jersey, at Stone Tavern in Allentown, is host to the Jersey Fresh International Three-Day Event this coming May. This event attracts some of the best riders in

the world as the competition is a key part to qualify for upcoming Olympics.

From May 8-11, there will be three events where these professional riders challenge their skill, all using the same horse. Throughout the competition, the horses are inspected and monitored by veterinarians to be sure they are safe to compete for each leg of the competition.

The first test is called a "dressage" test. This test of obedience and skill comprises a set series of intricate actions executed in an enclosed arena.

The second test is the four mile cross-country test. This will prove the speed, endurance and jumping ability of the horse when he is well trained and brought to peak condition while navigating twenty-four to thirty-six fixed and solid varied obstacles.

The test on the third day is a show jumping competition, which entails very precise riding; it consists of between twelve and fifteen show jumping obstacles, which normally include at least one combination, two spread fences, and in some cases a ditch or water jump.

There will be a contest for the best hat. Categories will be: Best Single Hat, Best Group of Hats and Horsiest Hat. Entries will be judged on creativity, interpretation of a theme and presentation. Admission fee is a fundraiser for the Horse Park of New Jersey.



As a Mother, Strong Is Not a Choice, It Is Simply Necessary...

aimlessly walked out of the emergency room in Palm Springs, California, stumbling to find the ground beneath my feet? I think I was in shock, I was disconnected from my own skin. I sat on the curb trying to regain some sense of breath and consciousness. I stared up at the most beautiful mountain that appeared to be looking back at me with angry eyes. I screamed a gut-wrenching scream at the top of my lungs, "WHY? What have I done? What do I do? Help me!" I couldn't breathe or swallow. I stood alone, trembling uncontrollably. I had never cried so hard in my life. A security guard, whom I will never forget, came up behind me and put his hand on my shoulder, offered me a box of tissues, and handed me a coin. He had witnessed my son being carried into the hospital in a strait-jacket, 100 pounds, third-degree burns, bloody head bound in gauze and tied down to a gurney, screaming abusively at the hospital staff and everyone that was helping him. They had to approach him in haz-mat suits. He spit on them and attempted to kick them as they tried to sew his eyebrow back in place. He acted less than human...where had my son gone? My son was addicted to heroin and crystal meth.

Our journey was painful and dark with many twists and turns. Dreams were banished, expectations diminished, goals were non-existent. These moments will never leave me and they have affected our family immensely. Addiction causes the entire family to become ill, the perspectives of each family member become twisted and tangled in the daily disorder and chaos. Hours, days and years pass in a creepy high-speed tunnel.

I can gratefully say today that my son Daniel is two years sober, after a long journey through addiction and through our treatment system. The creepy tunnel is gone, and the hours, days and years are being enjoyed and cherished. Our very personal experiences through this battle have caused us to take a stand and become educated about the treatment system, addiction, our community, and to be physically involved in the entire process so that we may help other people through the hell of addiction. We have been forced to overcome trauma, to heal our other children, to mend a bruised marriage, and to rebuild Daniel's life filled with passion and hope. We have analyzed, studied and met the most amazing knowledgeable, intuitive souls throughout this journey.


There is hope—it's actually all about hope!

Daniel's last in-patient treatment center changed him. It actually saved his life. I honor their approach and I believe in it. When he returned home from this treatment, we decided to create our own home-based program, using the model of hope and inspiration, not fear based and dis-empowering. I refused to trust anyone else with his life, I was too scared to loose him. In the past every time he completed a treatment program he learned how to do more drugs, different drugs and different ways to get higher? I would ask...Why is this happening? He would fail drug screens and I would not be informed, even with consent. The system was baffling and cunning just like the disease. Relapse after relapse!

I continued to ask questions, where there seemed such obvious short-comings? What happens when a person new to recovery goes home after treatment or during an outpatient program? It's only the beginning of the treatment process. Who do they socialize with? Can they get a job? Can they go back to school? What do they do with all the extra time while trying to remain clean and sober? What occupies their day? Is their home the best place for them?

This is a very fragile time and needs to be understood and recognized as a very important aspect of treatment. Aftercare is necessary for successful long term







The Historical Commission is dedicated to preserving the past and creating a living history. The types of projects eligible for funding are preservation, restoration or rehabilitation of historic structures, usually 50 years or older, and which are accessible to the public. The program covers essentially structural work for projects commonly known as "bricks and mortar" undertakings.

"The on-going preservation and restoration of meeting halls, offices, churches and former homes helps make history real and present in our daily lives," Burry said. "It is important to maintain and restore these landmarks to their glory and interpret their importance for generations to come."

The Monmouth County Historical Commission was created by the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the preservation and conservation of Monmouth County history. Established in August 1988, its principal program is the preservation grants, an undertaking that recognizes the acute need for funds to preserve Monmouth County's rich and diverse historic legacy. The commission grants matching funds on a competitive basis to municipalities and nonprofit organizations needing financial help in the preservation or restoration of historic structures.

Each grant application must include a description of the mission, its meaning to history and the significance and the audience it serves. It must also include a detailed budget, a source of funding available for the applicant's dollar-for-dollar contribution, detailed quotations for the work, the materials to be used and a time frame for completion.

The Historical Commission's Annual Preservation Awards ceremony was held Feb. 24 at the Hall of Records in Freehold where recipients received checks for the first half of their award.

The deadline for applying for the preservation grants is Nov. 1 of every year. Information about the Historical Commission grant program can be found at www.visitmonmouth.com.

Mom on a Mission

 $E_{\rm across}$ the globe. Some of them we relate to, and some we don't.

Back in July 2012, Manalapan resident Robin Nowicki dropped her children off at a local movie theater for a day with their friends. Shortly after, she learned of the shooting in a movie theater in Aurora Colorado. This brought to mind the parallel that her children were in similar circumstances and a tragedy can happen anywhere at any time. Shortly afterwards, in December of 2012, the shooting in the school in Newtown, Connecticut pushed her to look for an outlet for change.



On December 15, 2012, Shannon Watts launched a Facebook page to vent her sadness and anger over what happened at Sandy Hook Elementary School. She started Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, a grassroots Mom-grown movement for gun reform. 140,000 members in 40 states and growing, these are women on a mission to get our government to implement background checks for all firearms purchases, ban certain firearms that are termed assault weapons, ban ammunition magazines that hold more than 10 rounds and initiate a system to track the sale of large quan-

tities of ammunition. Monmouth County has roughly 50 members to date.

Robin said that New Jersey has a very effective system for background checks in place, but they are asking for every state to do the same. 75% of New Jersey gun violence were guns here illegally and not registered. Our state ranks #1 for trafficking illegal guns. Background checks here mean those who may not pass the check will go to other states to purchase their guns and bring them here. They will not be registered. If we have a national law, that hole in the system will be filled.

These ladies are not against gun ownership and many of their members are gun owners themselves. They respect the second amendment but also know that 40% of all guns sold are in states where there is no background check done. Legal gun owners in New Jersey would not be impacted if Congress passed a National standard of Universal Background Checks. A person with a criminal record or mental health issues should not own a gun as they would not pass the check.

In the United States, 100 people are shot each day, 33 of them die, 8 of them are kids. In the last 15 months since Newtown, there have been 43 school shootings. Many of these guns were owned illegally. Had a universal background check been in place, how many lives may have been saved?

In December 2013, Mayors Against Illegal Guns and Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America announced their merger into a nationwide movement of Americans working together to end gun violence. Now more than 1,000 mayors and more than 1.5 million Americans from big cities, small towns, and all different walks of life are working together.

What can you do? Call or email your representatives in Congress and demand that they support common-sense measures like background checks to curb gun violence. Spread the word and lend your support.
