



Advancing Opportunities, Inc. Helps Provide Service to People with Disabilities

Advancing Opportunities, Inc. provides services to people with disabilities and their families. The agency traces its roots back to a group of parents with children who had cerebral palsy; they banded together to advocate for their children.

The initial mission of the group was to help each other meet the challenges their families encountered raising their children. Those families faced barriers, a lack of services, and attitudes that were, at times, less than congenial. The parents persevered. The vision they had for their sons and daughters was that they would be welcomed in their communities; that their abilities and strengths would be recognized; and that they would be nurtured to grow and reach their fullest potential.

Nearly seventy years later, the agency continues their vital work. To give you an idea of the scope of their efforts, the agency provided services and supports to more than 3,000 individuals with disabilities and their families last year.

"Our mission is to achieve full societal participation for all people with disabilities," said CEO Jack Mudge. "We have a team of dedicated professionals who are committed to advancing the independence of children and adults with disabilities at home, school, work, and at play."

In the area of education, the agency's Special Education Advocates work with families to help ensure students with disabilities receive all they are entitled to in school. The agency's Assistive Technology Services team helps teachers and school districts make curriculums accessible to students of all abilities. Members of the AT team also provide evaluations to help students find the tools, software, and devices that will best suit their abilities.

The agency recently launched its Student Success Center, a collaboration

among its Advocacy, Assistive Technology and Career Development services that helps high school students with disabilities prepare for postsecondary programs. The Student Success Center also supports college students on campus and with their career goals. This program has developed partnerships with several colleges and the NJ Division of Vocational Rehabilitation.

Advancing Opportunities also provides access to the community to many men and women who were living in New Jersey's Developmental Centers. The agency currently operates 17 group homes around the state and is actively developing more housing opportunities for people disabilities. The agency's Residential Services team and its Assistive Technology team are currently working on getting smart home technology into all of the group homes. They are evaluating each resident's needs and providing training. Residents can keep in touch with family members via Face Time and control their immediate environments with Google Home products. The smart home technology is also used by the residential team to monitor and improve safety within the homes.

Additionally, the agency's Career Development team is working to give men and women with disabilities access to employment. The team helps individuals formulate career goals and develop plans for achieving them. The Family and Individual Supports team works to integrate people with disabilities into their communities by helping them get involved and stay active.

The agency's Assistive Technology Services team operates the Technology Lending Center, a library of devices and tools that people with disabilities in New Jersey can borrow and try, free of charge, before they commit to purchasing an item.



Weekend Getaways Fun Things to Do Near the Delaware Water Gap

In last month's issue, we talked about the different hiking trails and parks that are abundant throughout the mountains at the Delaware Water Gap, where you can get spectacular views from high mountain lookout points.

There are 40 miles of the Middle Delaware National Scenic and Recreational River, 67,000 acres of forested mountains, riverine valleys and fertile floodplains, tumbling waters, rhododendron ravines, and hemlock forests. There are more than 100 miles of hiking trails along streams, ridges, and mountaintops. There is bountiful wildlife in habitats ranging from rivers to ridge top, 27 miles of the Appalachian Trail, more than 100 miles of scenic roadways, Historic villages, structures, and landscapes from the valley's colonial past and Agricultural fields that have been farmed for more than a thousand years.

Do you like waterfalls? There are plenty in the Delaware water gap area. Bushkill Falls is a series of eight privately owned waterfalls, the tallest of which cascades over 100 feet; located in Northeast Pennsylvania's Pocono Mountains. Bushkill Falls encompasses about 300 acres and more than two miles of hiking trails, bridges and walkways. visitbushkillfalls.com

Other nearby Falls include: Deer Leap Pike, Silverhead Falls, Raymondskill Falls, Fulmer Falls, Silver Spray Falls, Factory Falls, Hacker Falls and Buttermilk Falls on the NJ side.

Shawnee Mountain Ski Area- Ski destination close to the Gap. Family-friendly skiing locale offering 23 slopes & trails, plus snow tubing, dining & lessons.

George W. Childs Recreation Site- Park known for housing 3 waterfalls, a short hiking trail & the ruins of an old woolen mill.

Claws 'n' Paws Wild Animal Park-Animal Park that offers a petting zoo with deer & lamb, animal shows, giraffe feedings & a turtle zone.


Lakota Wolf Preserve-Guided Educational tours to see 4 different packs of wolves play & interact, plus foxes & bobcats.

Milbrook Village- In 1832, a local farmer built a gristmill along the newly finished Columbia-Walpack Turnpike where it crossed a stream known as "Van Campens Mill Brook." By 1875, Millbrook had reached a peak of 75 inhabitants and about nineteen major buildings. Today's Millbrook Village does not replicate the Millbrook of 1832 or 1900. Rather, it evokes the feeling of countryside hamlets where most of the nation's people lived until the end of the 19th century. On summer weekends, several buildings are open to the public and Millbrook Village Society and other volunteers demonstrate the folkways of that era.

Grey Towers National Historic Site- Also known as Gifford Pinchot House or The Pinchot Institute is located just off US 6 west of Milford, Pennsylvania, in Dingman Township.

Pocono Tree Ventures, East Stroudsburg, Pa. - Aerial obstacle-course ziplines. Guests climb, balance & zip-line through the treetops on obstacle courses of varying difficult

The Zane Grey Museum in Lackawaxen Township- is a former residence of the author Zane Grey and is now maintained as a museum and operated by the National Park Service.

The Christmas Tree Factory- About one mile from the Gap. Rows and rows of Christmas ornaments and items. Quality fashioned jewelry. Also, there are craft items available. Fun to even just browse!

Antiques and Collectibles in Stroudsburg, PA-The Olde Engine Works Market Place is home to over 125 friendly and knowledgeable dealers, ready to help you find that perfect antique or collectible you have been searching for. 



QUESTION:

Why should I choose early orthodontic treatment for my child with a palate expander?



s Palatal expanders are often placed while a child is still growing. They are used to widen the upper jaw so that the upper teeth fit properly together out and over the lower teeth. Underdeveloped growth or narrowing of the upper jaw is one of the major causes of

crowding. If the upper jaw is too narrow, there is not enough room for all the permanent teeth to erupt, which results in crowding, crossbites, underbites, or an edge-to-edge bite. Palatal expanders will not prevent the need for braces when all the permanent teeth erupt, but often times will eliminate the need for extraction of permanent teeth to create space or invasive jaw surgery to correct the growth discrepancy after the jaws fully develop. As the palate begins to expand, it creates more room in the mouth for all of the teeth and the remaining teeth can begin to shift into position and will be far closer to their final position. A palate expander will reduce treatment time too. Different factors can lead to narrow upper jaw growth such as thumb-sucking, tongue thrusting or mouth breathing due to enlarged tonsils. Although these problems may look harmless, they may have serious long-term consequences on aesthetics and both dental and physical health. Palatal expanders often

times will eliminate the need for extraction of permanent teeth to create space or invasive jaw surgery to correct the growth discrepancy after the jaws fully develop and often makes the difference between a good orthodontic result and a great orthodontist result. 


The Affordable Housing Alliance Will Be Hosting a Groundbreaking for their Newest Homes





Chickpeas are a good source of protein, carbs, fiber, and many other nutrients. They may help with diabetes, blood pressure problems, heart issues, irritable bowel syndrome, cancer, and provides essential vitamins and minerals. This dish is a Plant-Based Protein and perfect for Vegans.

4 servings

Ingredients:

- Water, or cooking oil
- 1 small onion, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 15.5 oz. chickpeas, 1 can, rinsed and drained
- ½ cup whole wheat breadcrumbs
- 2 teaspoons fresh parsley, chopped
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper
- ½ teaspoon red pepper flakes, optional
- 1 egg

Preparation:

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°F (190°C).
- 2. In a skillet over medium heat, add cooking oil or water and onions. Cook until onions are translucent, stirring occasionally.
- 3. Add the garlic and stir until fragrant. Transfer to a blender or food processor.
- 4. To the food processor, add the chickpeas, breadcrumbs, parsley, oregano, salt, pepper, red pepper flakes, and egg. Pulse until a dough forms.

Gluten-free Butter Dough Biscuits

Ingredients

- 1 cup full-fat Greek yogurt
- 2 cups gluten-free flour blend, plus more for flouring
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- salt, as desired

- 1. Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C).

BBQ Grilled Fruits

This is a healthy, low calorie and clean-eating dessert that you can serve up after dinner, for a snack or just because! Fresh fruit from the grill tastes amazing!

Summer fruit with pits like peaches, nectarines and plums grill spectacularly. The sugars in these fruits intensify when grilled. Choose ripe fruit that's still firm so it will hold up to the heat. Then slice the fruit in half, remove the pit and brush with a honey glaze (recipe below) and grill about three minutes per side (plums only need to cook about two minutes per side). You can also use Canola Oil as a glaze for fresh fruit on the grill.

For fruits like pineapple, papaya and mango on the grill, start by slicing the fruit lengthwise and removing the seeds. You can score the flesh or leave it uncut before brushing with the canola oil or honey glaze and grilling. For pineapple, trim the ends, slice into quarters then core and peel (removing any remaining eyes with a small paring knife). Cut each quarter into wedges, then brush with a honey glaze before grilling. Mango will cook in 2 to 3 minutes per side, Papaya halves in about 3 minutes per side, and pineapple slices in 3 to 4 minutes per side.

Honey Glaze Kecipe: Combine 3 parts honey with 1 part fresh orange or lemon juice and mix well. An add-on to this recipe is blending honey with 1 part rum or your favorite liqueur.





FAMILY MATTERS

WHAT IS A STATUTE OF **LIMITATIONS?**

A statute of limitations is a timeframe or deadline within which one has to file a certain type of case. New Jersey (and every other state) has various statutes of limitations depending upon the type and nature of the case. For instance, the statute of limitations for a personal injury claim in the State of New Jersey is two years. On the other hand, the statute of limitations for a breach of contract claim is six years. Thus, in the event a lawsuit is not filed within the respective time frames for each of these types of claims, the ability to file such a lawsuit may be lost forever. Importantly, however, there are many other factors and issues concerning statutes of limitations other than merely the time frame set forth in the various statutes.

One of the first issues that must be determined when dealing with a statute of limitations is the date upon which the potential cause of action "accrued." Basically, the accrual date is the date that the statute of limitations time begins to run. Although the statute of limitations for a personal injury claim is two years, the accrual date for such a claim may not necessarily be the date that the injury was actually sustained. In certain cases, the accrual date will be the date that the person knew or reasonably should have known that their injury was caused by the wrongdoing of another. Similarly, in breach of contract cases, although the six year time frame begins to run upon the breach of the contract, there are many intricacies in our law as to when a contract is actually breached.

Another issue that arises when determining a statute of limitations time frame is whether or not a particular statute of limitations may be "tolled." This means that the statute of limitations "timeclock" stops for one reason or another thus extending the statute of limitations deadline. Typically, the time will "stop that the statute of limitations deadline. running" for the period of time that a person is not competent to file a lawsuit. The main example of this is for a person who is under the age of 18 years old. Because a "minor" is not "competent" to file a lawsuit under the eyes of the law, the time under the statute of limitations will toll until that individual attains the age of 18. For example, in a personal injury case, the statute of limitations for an injured individual under the age of 18 will not be until that individual's 20th birthday which is two years after they attain the age of majority. birthday which is two years after they attain the age of majority.

Importantly, in addition to statutes of limitation, there are other timeframe provisions both in New Jersey law and other states' laws which require some type of written notification to a legal entity within a certain period of time. These timeframes are routinely significantly shorter than a statute of limitation. For instance, in New Jersey, if an injury is sustained as a result of the negligence of a public entity (Township, Borough, City, County, State of New Jersey, etc.), written notification must be provided to that entity within 90 days of the accrual of the cause of action otherwise the ability to sue the public entity may be lost forever. Another such written notification provision in the State of New Jersey is where an injury is sustained in an amusement park.

As you can see, there are many legal pitfalls with respect to statutes of limitation and time frames within which action must be taken by a potential litigant. Of course, this article only scratches the surface with regard to these issues and, regardless of what type of claim that you have, it is important that you immediately seek legal advice from an attorney as soon as you believe that you have a claim against someone else. Your failure to do so may jeopardize your ability to obtain compensation for your damages.


Consequences vs. Punishments

Relaxation techniques may be helpful in managing a variety of health conditions, including anxiety associated with illnesses or medical procedures, insomnia, labor pain, chemotherapy-induced nausea, and temporomandibular joint dysfunction. Psychological therapies, which may include relaxation techniques, can help manage chronic headaches and other types of chronic pain in children and adolescents. Relaxation techniques have also been studied for other conditions, but either they haven't been shown to be useful, research results have been inconsistent, or the evidence is limited.

Relaxation techniques are generally considered safe for healthy people, although there have been a few reports of negative experiences such as increased anxiety. People with serious physical or mental health problems should discuss relaxation techniques with their health care providers.

Relaxation techniques include several practices such as progressive relaxation, guided imagery, biofeedback, self-hypnosis, and deep breathing exercises. The goal is similar in all: to produce the body's natural relaxation response, characterized by slower breathing, lower blood pressure, and a feeling of increased well-being.

Researchers have evaluated relaxation techniques to see whether they could play a role in managing a variety of health conditions, including the following:

- Asthma
- Childbirth
- Depression
- Epilepsy
- Fibromyalgia
- Headache
- Heart Disease
- High Blood Pressure
- Insomnia
- Irritable Bowel Syndrome
- Menopause Symptoms
- Menstrual Cramps
- Nausea
- Nightmares

- Pain
- Pain in Children and Adolescents
- Posttraumatic Stress Disorder
- Rheumatoid Arthritis
- Ringing in the Ears (Tinnitus)
- Smoking Cessation
- Temporomandibular Joint Dysfunction

Relaxation techniques are generally considered safe for healthy people. However, occasionally, people report negative experiences such as increased anxiety, intrusive thoughts, or fear of losing control.





At present, all students receive vision screening as per NJ School Health Service Guidelines and may be subjective due to multiple variables.

Traverse Rock Climbing Wall (\$8,292) (Evan Norwood, primary school physical education teacher) - The grant consists of a Traverse Rock Climbing Wall, which will be installed in the primary school gymnasium. It will benefit students by giving them an opportunity to improve muscular strength, cardiovascular endurance, fine and gross motor skill development, balance, coordination, and flexibility. The cognitive values include incorporating math and literacy into climbing activities, problem solving, decision making, focus and concentration.

Programmable Robotics Kits for STEAM (\$4,943.40) (Erik Wall, middle school related arts teacher) - The grant consists of LEGO programmable Robotics Kits, to enhance the middle school Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics (STEAM) curriculum. The program, which is a three-year progression, will empower students to utilize an engaging and proven technology platform to develop and improve coding, design and analysis skills. It also will better integrate core science and mathematics concepts into the STEAM experience.

Math Lab: Making Math Fun Again (\$4,828.79) (Lisa Murin, math coach for primary and elementary schools) - The grant consists of two math labs – in the primary and elementary schools – for K-5 students, which will create spaces to allow learning through play. Students and teachers will have access to manipulatives and lessons that are rich in real-world application and go beyond the lessons found within the program used in classrooms. Students in lab will have the use of water tables, cooking lessons, scales, measuring tapes and more to enhance their personal experience.

STEAM Makerspace (\$2,864.88) (Nicole Meyrick, third grade teacher and Meghan Olah, third grade teacher) - The grant consists of a LEGO wall to provide opportunities for students to engage in a creative, imaginative and playful atmosphere, which will allow learning to unfold, rather than conform to set tasks. In addition, there will be two Brick Labs, which will contain 200 hands-on activities to enhance and support the STEAM curriculum. The grant will be used as a STEAM Lab, Makerspace for hands-on science, math and STEAM lessons, as well as for the gifted and talented program.



Are Redheads More Sensitive to Pain?

Everyone struggles with pain at some point of his or her life, but did you know that, according to some researchers, studies have shown that redheads are more sensitive to pain than others?

- Redheads typically have a low tolerance to cold weather
- They are less receptive to anesthesia
- Less tolerant of inflammatory pain

- At a greater risk of developing sclerosis and endometriosis
- Lack vitamin D as they tend to stay out of the sun more for fear of burning more easily
- More prone to certain skin cancers

On the other hand, other researchers have found that redheads were:

- Tougher when it came to handling pain.
- Less sensitive to stinging pain
- Have thicker hair and skip over the gray hair stage and go from light copper to white hair.
- More noticed by the opposite sex. When a redhead walks into a room, there's a good chance they will be noticed.



The Kortney Rose Foundation by Pam Teel

Kortney Rose Gillette was a vivacious nine-year old girl with a winning smile and unparalleled zest for life. She was in the third grade. She loved playing with friends and animals (stuffed or real) and enjoyed school at Wolf Hill Elementary School in Oceanport, NJ. This didn't change even after her diagnosis of a terminal brainstem glioma (Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma -DIPG). Kortney loved basketball and played soccer, but her biggest thrills were at amusement parks and water slides. She was a daredevil with little fear and a spitfire who knew how to get her way. Her smile and laugh would brighten any room she entered or place she visited. She loved to play on her swing set and was always on the move to her next play date.

Kortney was the picture of health at her ninth birthday party on November 27, 2005 where the family celebrated at Funtime America. In the second week of December she had a couple times where she came in from playing and laid on the couch saying her head hurt. They seemed to go away in about 10 minutes and she'd go back and play like nothing was ever wrong. This happened a few more times. A couple of days later she was outside playing in the snow and she looked up and her mom noticed that her left eye was crossed, turned inward. That day she made an appointment with an optometrist who told her that sometimes the "sixth nerve palsy" can be caused by a virus and the eye may go back on its own, but just to be sure she ordered an MRI.



It was roughly two weeks later that Kortney's parents were told by the doctor that she had an inoperable brain tumor. On April 27, 2006, four months after her diagnosis, Kortney lost her brave battle with this pediatric brain cancer.

As a way to help channel their grief into something positive, Kortney's parents set up the Kortney Rose Foundation. Their hopes are to make a difference, in Kortney's name, in the fight to find better treatments and ultimately a cure for pediatric brain tumors. Their fundraising efforts will directly benefit pediatric brain tumor research.

Established in Oceanport, NJ, in 2006, the Kortney Rose Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) charity with the mission of funding research to promote better treatments and cures for brain tumors, the #1 disease killer of children. With a battle cry of "Help Get Brain Tumors off Kids' Minds," the foundation is responsible for nearly \$2 million donated to pediatric brain/central nervous system tumor research. KRF prioritizes collaborative research, and was an original research partner that helped to establish the Children's Brain Tumor and Tissue Consortium (CBTTC).

About CBTTC

With its operation center based out of the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP), the CBTTC is made up of 17 global institutions, operates the world's largest clinically-annotated database of pediatric genomic data in the world, via CAVATICA, a first of its kind cloud-based, open source platform pioneered by CHOP. These advancements are having implications for broader pediatric cancer and structural birth defect research through the National Institute of Health's Gabriella Miller Kids First Program with which KRF is involved through CHOP.

Brain tumors are the #1 cause of death by disease in children and with only 4% of the federal government's annual research budget going to kids, its small foundations like this one that are helping to fund this gap to keep research going since the other 96% of the federal government's cancer research budget funds adult cancer research.

To raise money, the Foundation holds many Family friendly events. They recently held a new event called Pony Up for Kids at Monmouth Park. There were pony rides, bouncers, crafts, basket raffle, food in a private picnic area and more.

Their signature event, now in its 13th year, is on Sunday, August 5, Kortney's Challenge 2 Mile Fun Run/Walk. It's fun for all ages and since it's a walk and a run anyone can participate. All registered children under 12 receive a custom medal. Free face painting, balloon animals, free food in finish area, grandstand entry to the day of horse racing and more.

Brain tumors/ cancer are devastating diseases. DIPG, the kind of tumor Kortney had is fatal in every instance and has a 9-month average survival rate. That's why the people at the Kortney Rose Foundation are determined and passionate about gathering support for brain cancer research and prevention. Pediatric cancer research needs more support to accelerate findings toward better treatments and cures. They've been supporting brain tumor research at CHOP and were instrumental in helping them build the Children's Brain Tumor Tissue Consortium and other centers that have grown up around this initiative all based on collaboration.

NEW NEWS: Diabetes in Children and Teens

Until recently, the common type of diabetes in children and teens was type 1. It was called juvenile diabetes. With Type 1 diabetes, the pancreas does not make insulin. Insulin is a hormone that helps glucose, or sugar, get into your cells to give them energy. Without insulin, too much sugar stays in the blood.

Now younger people are also getting type 2 diabetes. Type 2 diabetes used to be called adult-onset diabetes. But now it is becoming more common in children and teens, due to more obesity. With Type 2 diabetes, the body does not make or use insulin well. Over time, high blood glucose can lead to serious problems with your heart, eyes, kidneys, nerves, and gums and teeth.

Children have a higher risk of type 2 diabetes if they are overweight or have obesity, have a family history of diabetes, or are not active. Children who are African American, Hispanic, Native American/Alaska Native, Asian American, or Pacific Islander also have a higher risk. To lower the risk of type 2 diabetes in children

- Have them maintain a healthy weight
- Be sure they are physically active
- Have them eat smaller portions of healthy foods
- Limit time with the TV, computer, and video

Children and teens with type 1 diabetes may need to take insulin. Type 2 diabetes may be controlled with diet and exercise. If not, patients will need to take oral diabetes medicines or insulin. A blood test called the A1C can check on how you are managing your diabetes.





Remembering to Remember

Your memory shapes your identity as well as holds a record of your entire life. Your ability to form memories does not occur until around the age of five.

Supposedly anyone can become a memory master by training their brain. Essentially, what you're doing is improving and expanding the connectivity between different centers in your brain. Memory training involves improving the connectivity in the brain.

Other devices to help you remember words, information or concepts include using:

- Acronyms (such as ATD for "Ask The Doctor")
- Visualizations (such as imagining a comb to remember you have an appointment for a haircut)
- Rhymes (remembering to tunes like "Thirty days haveth September")
- Chunking breaking up information into smaller "chunks" (such as organizing groups)
- Visualize pay attention to photographs, charts, and other graphics to have visual cues
- Mediation/Bridging a bridge is built in between the items given to be memorized
- Stop Multitasking it it may actually slow you down, make you prone to errors as well as make you forgetful
- REST

If you're not quite ready to take up a foreign language, piano lessons or knitting, you may still be able to bolster the growth of new brain cells and neural connections by challenging your mind with various games and puzzles.

There is vast evidence that exercise produces large cognitive gains and helps fight dementia. Those who exercise have a greater volume of gray matter in the hippocampal region, which is important for memory and exercise also prevents age-related shrinkage of your brain. Research also shows that exercising four hours after learning something new helps you retain what you've just learned long-term.

The human brain has remarkable flexibility, and has the ability to regenerate and form new connections throughout your life. You lose certain memories but can make new ones and form new connections. Engaging in stimulating social activities, artistic pursuits and crafts keep your mind sharper with age and prevent cognitive decline, thus the importance of socialization versus social isolation for the elderly. Leisure activities that challenge the brain like chess and card games help maintain cognition.

Legal and Financial Planning for People with Alzheimer's

Many people are unprepared to deal with the legal and financial consequences of a serious illness such as Alzheimer's disease. Legal and medical experts encourage people recently diagnosed with a serious illness to examine and update their financial and healthcare arrangements as soon as possible. Basic legal and financial documents, such as a will, a living trust, and advance directives, are needed to ensure that the person's late-stage or end-of-life healthcare and financial decisions are carried out.

Families beginning the legal planning process should discuss several strategies and legal documents. Depending on the family situation and the applicable State laws, a lawyer may introduce some or all the following terms and documents to assist in this process:

- Documents that communicate the healthcare wishes of someone who can no longer make healthcare decisions
- Documents that communicate the financial management and estate plan wishes of someone who can no longer make financial decisions

Advance directives for financial and estate management must be created while the person with Alzheimer's still can make these decisions (sometimes referred to as "having legal capacity" to make decisions). These directives may include the following:

A will indicates how a person's assets and estate will be distributed upon death. It also can specify:

- Arrangements for care of minors
- Gifts
- Trusts to manage the estate
- Funeral and/or burial arrangements

Medical and legal experts say that the newly diagnosed person with Alzheimer's and his or her family should move quickly to make or update a will and secure the estate. Healthcare providers cannot act as legal or financial advisers, but they can encourage planning discussions between patients and their families.

Start discussions early. The rate of decline differs for each person with Alzheimer's disease, and his or her ability to be involved in planning will decline over time.

Review plans regularly, and update documents as needed.

What do senior citizens rank as their highest priority as they age? Financial Security? Health? Family is actually the most important factor in maintaining a high quality of life in Americans' senior years, according to a recent survey.

- 53 percent are very or somewhat concerned about their savings and income to last the rest of their life.
- 41 percent of working seniors indicate that social security will be their primary source of retirement income.

Technology

- 34 percent stated 'I don't understand how to use it' as a barrier preventing them from using more technology.
- 47 percent say cost prevents their use of technology.

Overall Outlook

- 57 percent of seniors state that overall, the past year of their life has been normal
- 21 percent of seniors expect their lives to get much or somewhat better over the next 5-10 years.

Smell and Taste Change as You Age

Did you know that your sense of smell and taste are connected? As you get older, these senses can change. Changes in smell or taste can also be a sign of a larger problem.

Many problems cause a loss of smell that lasts for a short time. This temporary loss of smell may be due to:

- A cold or flu that causes a stuffy nose. The ability to smell will come back when you're better.
- Allergies. Try to stay away from things you're allergic to, like pollen and pets. Talk to your doctor about how to manage your allergies.
- A harmless growth (called a polyp) in the nose or sinuses that gives you a runny nose. Having the growth removed may help.
- Some medications like antibiotics or blood pressure medicine. Ask your doctor if there is another medicine you can take.

Sometimes, losing your sense of smell may be a sign of a more serious disorder, such as Parkinson's disease or Alzheimer's disease. Be sure to tell your doctor about any change in your sense of smell.

When food tastes bland, many people try to improve the flavor by adding more salt or sugar. This may not be healthy for older people, especially if you have medical problems like high blood pressure or diabetes (high blood sugar).



Many things can cause you to lose your sense of taste. Most of the time there are ways to help with the problem.

Medications, like antibiotics and pills to lower cholesterol and blood pressure, can sometimes change how food tastes. Some medicines can make your mouth dry. Having a dry mouth can cause food to taste funny and also make it hard to swallow. Talk to your doctor if you think a medicine is affecting your sense of taste. There may be different medicines that you can try. Do not stop taking your medicine.

Gum disease, an infection in your mouth, or issues with your dentures can leave a bad taste in your mouth that changes the way food tastes. Brushing your teeth, flossing, and using mouthwash can help prevent these problems. Talk to your dentist if you have a bad taste in your mouth that won't go away.

Allentown Composer Receives Prestigious Award

Charles Andrew Rudin has been a resident of Allentown for 27 years. All of his life, he has been passionately involved with music. He spent most of his adult life as a composer of contemporary Classical Music. His time and passion for his music has paid off royally as Charles, who goes by his middle name Andrew, was one of four winning composers given a prestigious award by the American Academy of Arts and Letters 2018 Music Awards on May 23rd, in NYC. The winners were selected by a committee of the Academy members.

The composers each received \$10,000 Arts and Letters Awards in Music, which honor outstanding artistic achievement and acknowledge composers who have arrived at their own voice. They each received an additional \$10,000 toward the recording of one work and will have their music presented in a concert at the Academy in the spring of 2019. The organization was founded in 1898, by (among others) Theodore Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, and Mark Twain. Rudin pronounced (roo- Deen) comes from Swedish immigrants.



Allentown Composer Charles Andrew Rusin

To Andrew, life in Allentown is ideal for him because he can walk to the post office, library, and various shops and restaurants, but at the same time he has convenient access to events in both New York and Philadelphia, as well as the resources of Princeton.

Andrew grew up in a small town in Texas where most of the people were employees of Texas Gulf Sulphur Company. The town founded in 1920, was dismantled in 1993 when mining and processing of sulphur finally ceased.

During that time when his father was transferred to Beaumont, Texas, Andrew broadened his studies by learning to play the trombone and the cello, while continuing with piano lessons and experimenting with various other instruments (flute, harp, jazz vibraphone). The generous tax base that local industry provided meant extensive equipment and opportunities for choral programs, marching and concert bands, a string orchestra, a jazz band, and a full symphony orchestra, including oboes, bassoons, horns, harp, and a complete percussion section.

Andrew credits one of his music teachers for opening the doors of the Arts for him. She taught him music theory, Bach, Mozart, and Chopin, and took him to see the Metropolitan Opera on tour in Houston. He felt very fortunate to have had such a sophisticated teacher eager to share her love for music and equally fortunate to have had parents who supported him in his musical endeavors.

At fifteen, he composed short fragments and arrangements that he got to hear in readings from his school orchestra. In both junior high and high school he wrote Broadway-style musical comedies, complete with pit orchestra. His earliest public performance was of his Comic Overture, an expanded full-orchestra version of the overture to the musical comedy, Triple Double-Cross. He attended All-state Orchestra as a cellist, and entered their composition contest winning second prize.

Andrew came east in the 1960's to go to University of Pennsylvania. He lived most of his life in Philadelphia and in NYC, and was on the music faculties of The University of the Arts (Phila.) and The Juilliard School.

His Il Giuoco (1966) was the first large-scale work for Moog synthesizer. With his Nonesuch LP Tragoedia, working as music assistant to Alwin Nikolais Dance Company, and inclusion in the sound-track of the film, Fellini Satyricon, he received early recognition primarily in the field of electronic music. Scores for many dance companies followed, including The Pennsylvania Ballet, as well as incidental music for theatre, and television. His opera, The Innocent, was produced in Philadelphia by Tito Capobianco. Recent concertos for violin, viola, and piano, along with numerous chamber music commissions, have brought him renewed recognition.

Purewater, a chamber opera, written in collaboration with librettist Ann McCutchan, will be presented by The Center for Contemporary Opera in fall 2018. Andrew is now retired but he continues with his composing.

This phrase actually first appeared in John Gay's Poem, "New Song on New Similes," in 1732, I....... Cool as a cucumber could see the rest of womankind." Describes someone as relaxed, calm, and unemotional. On a hot day, cucumbers tend to remain cool on the inside.



Bring Home the Bacon

This phrase is attributed to the story of Dunmow Flitch. In 1104, a couple in Great Dunmow, Essex, impressed the Prior of Little Dunmow so much with their love and devotion that he awarded them a side of bacon. The meaning according to today's standards suggests: To earn money, particularly for one's family, to be successful, especially financially successful.

Basket Case

Originally this term was used by the U.S. Military after WWI referring to soldiers who lost arms and legs and had to be carried by others.

Frog in the Throat

The earliest use of this name for a sore throat was actually supposed to be a cure. If you refer to a particular state of affairs, you mean the general situation and circumstances connected with someone or something. Example, "Now that's a sorry state of affairs."


Get the sack

- Edward Rutledge was the youngest signer of the Declaration of Independence at the age of 26 while Benjamin Franklin, 70 years old as the oldest.
- Three U.S. presidents actually died on July 4. On July 4, 1826: John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, James Monroe, who died July 4, 1831.
- Americans began observing the Fourth of July as early as 1777, when the first-ever major celebration in Philadelphia included a parade, a thirteen-shot cannon salute and fireworks.
- In 1870, almost a hundred years after the Declaration was written, Congress first declared July 4 to be a national holiday as part of a bill to officially recognize several holidays, including Christmas.
- More legislation about national holidays, including July 4, was passed in 1939 and 1941.
- Calvin Coolidge, our 30th president, was born on Independence Day.
- July Fourth is the "biggest hot dog holiday of the year," with Americans reportedly consuming about 155 million of them on Independence Day alone.

Did you know....

Did you know that famous architect Frank Lloyd Wright's son John invented the Lincoln Logs that most of us played with as a child? From the Guggenheim Museum to Fallingwater, architect Frank Lloyd Wright designed some of America's most iconic structures. Less known, however, is that another one of his designs inspired the creation of one of history's most popular children's toys, the Lincoln Logs.

Growing up in Oak Park, Illinois, John Lloyd Wright spent hour after hour in the "wonderland playroom" designed by his father. Underneath a soaring barrel-vaulted ceiling, the second child of famed architect Frank Lloyd Wright constructed his own wonders using just his imagination and a collection of assorted building blocks developed by Friedrich Froebel, the German educator who championed the concept of kindergarten.

By the time he turned 24, John was working side-by-side with his father as chief assistant on the design of Tokyo's Imperial Hotel. Faced with the challenge of building a structure that could withstand the powerful earthquakes that regularly shook Japan, Frank Lloyd Wright sketched an ingenious design that relied on a system of interlocking timber beams that would allow the hotel to sway but not collapse in case of a tremor. (The Imperial Hotel would indeed be one of the few buildings that remained standing after the 1923 Great Kanto Earthquake that devastated Tokyo.)

The relationship between father and son, however, crumbled over money long before the earthquake-proof hotel was ever constructed. Out-of-work, John Lloyd Wright turned his attention to a pint-sized design project. In 1916, using the blue-print for the Imperial Hotel as a model, he created a toy construction set that consisted of notched pieces of wood that children could stack to build log cabins, forts, and other rustic buildings. Unlike Froebel's building blocks, the interlocking system of miniature logs could withstand the shockwaves unleashed by children's playing roughly with the toys.

In 1918, John Lloyd Wright began to market his creation through his own firm, the Red Square Toy Company, and two years later he received a patent for his "toy-cabin construction." He bestowed upon his creation an alliterative name that also evoked

an American icon—Lincoln Logs. The toy came with instructions to build not only Abraham Lincoln's Kentucky boyhood home, but a famous log structure from the pages of American literature, Uncle Tom's Cabin. The toy's packaging featured a simple drawing of a log cabin, a small portrait of Lincoln and the slogan "Interesting playthings typifying the spirit of America." Capitalizing on both nostalgia for the frontier at a time when the United States was becoming increasingly urbanized and a wave of patriotism in the wake of World War I, Lincoln Logs became an instant success.

While restrictions on metals and other materials constrained the production of other toys during World War II, wooden Lincoln Logs continued to roll off factory lines. (The notched building logs, originally carved from redwood, are now manufactured from stained pine.) Lincoln Logs peaked in popularity during the 1950s when it was among the first toys mass-marketed on television. The toy's rustic brand tied in perfectly with popular children's shows such as "Davy Crockett, King of the Wild Frontier" that were watched by tens of thousands of young "baby boomers" on their black-and-white televisions.

A century after their creation, low-tech Lincoln Logs continue to be popular in a high-tech world. Over 100 million sets have been sold worldwide, and Lincoln Logs were inducted into the National Toy Hall of Fame in 1999.

John Lloyd Wright attempted to build on the success of Lincoln Logs in the 1930s with Wright Blocks, a toy construction set with interlocking wooden shapes that allowed budding architects to build castles or other complex designs. Wright Blocks, however, proved too intricate and lacked the same appeal as Lincoln Logs.

John Lloyd Wright sold his company to Playskool in 1943 for only \$800. The copyright for Lincoln Logs eventually passed to toy companies Milton Bradley and Hasbro. Since 1991, the rights to produce Lincoln Logs have been licensed by K'NEX, which announced in 2014 that the stackable wooden construction sets would again be manufactured in the United States after years of being produced in China.


